Charity Bee

For the Food Bank at the October 2019 guild meeting, we collected \$60!!!! (Not sure if that is a record for one collection, but it was a great one!) This brings our YTD total to \$377! Only TWO more months to try and reach a \$500 goal!!! Two more collections like this one and we'll be close! The next Charity Bee meeting is on Tuesday, October 15, 2019, at Fabric Carousel, beginning at 9:30 am. As a reminder, Charity Bee collects Fabric Carousel fat quarter wrappers and Hobbs batting UPC labels. At the guild meeting, I showed walker caddies that I have been working on (for the men) and Barbara Pearson (who heads this endeavor) is asking for help in either cutting kits to make the caddies, or to complete them. There is always a need for caddies at our local nursing homes. Also, Barbara Edmondson is willing to share a pattern to make adult bibs for our local nursing home patients. Barbara E. also has an alternative/simpler walker caddie pattern she will share. Charity Bee has lots of fabric suitable for making both the walker caddies and the bibs. We have plenty of layered and pinned HUGS (quilt tops) in the work room at Fabric Carousel waiting to be finished. There are only two more Charity Bee meetings for this year and whatever items we have completed after November will be all that is delivered to our local recipients in early December (Pregnancy Care Center, SAAFE House, Hospitality House, and CPS, and any items for the nursing homes). So if there are items almost finished, please try to get them finished and delivered to Fabric Carousel by first of December (or give them to me at the November guild meeting). Pregnancy Care also LOVES receiving the crocheted baby beanies, as well as bibs, receiving blankets, and of course our beautiful HUGs. As always, big "thank you" to all who participate!
